Milk and Fruit

Children are offered fruit daily; these range from bananas to carrots or even strawberries.



Milk is free until the term of your child's 5th birthday. The school office will be in touch to explain how to pay for milk should you wish for it to continue after your child turns 5.

Physical Development

We provide opportunities for children to develop both their gross motor and fine motor skills every day through both our indoor and outdoor classrooms. Part of the curriculum focuses on dressing and undressing independently; this is something you can help with at home.

Independence

A big part of the Early Years is to foster children's independence. This can be putting on their own coats, going to the toilet independently, taking their shoes on and off, washing their hands and using a knife and fork at lunch. We focus on many of these areas in school and support children in becoming independent. We also ask that these are things you work on with your child at home on a day-to-day basis.
