

## Parental information – continuation of your child's learning when they are accessing their lessons remotely

As you will be aware, the government have provided schools with clear guidelines to support the management of Covid-19 in our school and the community and on occasions we might need to ask groups of children to access their learning remotely. This would mean that they will learn from home one week followed by a week of in-school learning.

We have set out clear guidelines of our expectations of pupils and staff to allow for the continuation of learning when pupils are remote working. Your child has been made aware of these expectations and we would appreciate it if you could support your child in adhering to them.
